

**LTC Dean Wilt from the Joint Staff J-4 briefed JOCOTAS on DoD's Contingency Basing Policy Governance and Goals:** The DoD Vision for Contingency Basing (CB) is to provide resilient, secure, sustainable, scalable, and interoperable contingency staging capabilities/locations worldwide at any time and in any environment. The effort is being led by the PDUSD AT&L, with the Joint Staff (J-4), as the Lead Integrator in support of the Contingency Basing Executive Council (CBEC), whose mission is to institutionalize CB by developing doctrine, organization, training, materiel, leadership and education, personnel, facilities, and policy (DOTMLPF-P) solutions to achieve synchronized capabilities that meet the combatant commander's mission requirements, increases operational flexibility, and supports the full range of military operations. DoD Directive 3000.10, *Contingency Basing Outside the United States*, provides the overarching policy to guide the effort and establish key responsibilities. This document, dated January 10, 2013 is approved for public release. Contingency locations support, sustain, and enable force application across a full range of military operations and capabilities. Quality of life standards are defined in terms of base maturity and Warfighter deployment time. Contingency locations are non-enduring and differ from enduring locations that are managed by the Global Posture Executive Council (GPEC).
