

# Seabee History



*Seabees – Can Do*


- Established in 1942 to provide combatant construction capability to support the war in the Pacific
- Involved in all US military operations since WWII: Korea, Vietnam, Iraq, Somalia, Bosnia, Kosovo, Afghanistan, and Iraq (II)
- Homeported in Port Hueneme and Gulfport, MS; Seabees deploy throughout the world
- Commanded by the 1st Naval Construction Division



# Forward Engagement Deployment for Training (DFT)



- Battalions can respond to Disaster Relief (DR), Humanitarian Assistance (HA), and Exercise Related Construction (ERC) missions throughout their deployments.



St. Croix: Seabees constructed administrative & maintenance facilities for USNORTHCOM and the HIDTA anti-drug task force



Albania: Seabees completed 25 miles of roadwork in support of Operation Shining Hope, a multinational operation bringing food and shelter to thousands of Kosovo refugees



# Seabee Combat Capability



Seabees – Can Do

- Seabee Battalion (NMCB) Manning:
  - NMCBs (8 Active and 12 Reserve)
    - Wartime: 812 officer & enlisted personnel
    - Peacetime: 625 officer & enlisted personnel
- Table of Allowance (TOA) P25:
  - Tools, equipment, tent camp, etc. for entire NMCB
  - Staged on MPFs & forward deployed mainbody sites
- Civil Engineer Support Equipment for NMCB TOA:
  - 277 pieces of CESE per P25

## Total 1NCD Force (6Jan04)

- 16,336 billets
- 6,431 active/9,905 reserve
- 661 officers/15,675 enlisted



## Total 1NCD Equip

- 31 TOAs
- Approx 6000 pieces of CESE



- Combat Weapons:
  - Capable of defending grid square with full battalion strength
  - Includes 60mm mortars, Mk19s, M2s, M240Bs and AT-4s
